- At least three years of teaching and/or research experience at a tertiary institution and related industry experience.
- Proficiency in MS Office and essential photography software, such as Adobe Photoshop, Lightroom, Premiere Pro or similar.
- Fluency in English is essential.
- Completion of the TUT License to Teach programme is compulsory for the role.
